Dear Friends,

This Tuesday, September 5th, is the feast day of Saint Teresa of Calcutta; although, when Pope Francis canonized her last September, he assured the crowd gathered in Saint Peter's Square that she will always be known with great affection as simply, 'Mother Teresa'. This Tuesday actually marks the twentieth anniversary of her death.

Mother Teresa was an extraordinary woman of faith who challenged us to grow in faith; who showed us humility in living; who cared for those who were rejected by others; and, who embraced those who were shunned by society. She saw the presence of God in every human person and treated every person – from royalty to lepers - with the same reverence and respect. Presidents and Prime Ministers would compete to be close to her; celebrities were much more enamored by her presence than she was with their status; and the ordinary person on the street would cherish the opportunity to be near her. Her holiness was evident, simply and yet, profound.

She truly was a 'saint' of our times, who reminded us during her lifetime that holiness is not found in 'things', but is found in seeking and knowing the presence of God in our lives and our world.

Below is a work attributed to Mother Teresa. It offers simple, yet profound advice on how we can truly search and find ways to grow in holiness in the ordinary moments of our lives. I hope you find something in Mother Teresa's words to help you in living your faith - the faith she loved so much in this life and now enjoys in its fulfillment in the eternal presence of the Lord!

Through the intercession of Saint John the Evangelist, may we be living examples of the gospel that he has handed onto us!

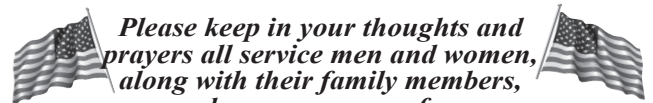

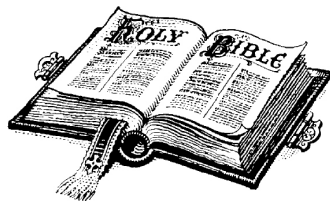
