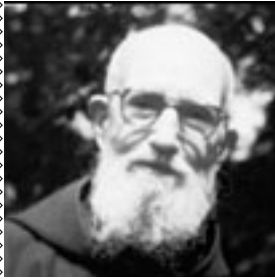

Let me begin this column by asking a question. What takes place in Detroit's Ford Field? Well, if you are a football fan you will answer readily. It is the home field for the Detroit Lions. So, why am I asking this question and why do we need to know? Friends, something wonderful happened this Saturday, November 18th, in Ford Field and it wasn't a football game. No, it was much more! Before 64,000 people, Venerable Solanus Casey, OFM Cap was beatified which is the next step toward sainthood. What do we know about this American born friar? Bernard Casey was born on a small Wisconsin farm of Irish immigrant parents in 1870. "Barney" was the sixth of 16 children. His health was compromised early on and so his formal education was greatly limited. After attempting a series of jobs, Barney left Wisconsin and continued to look for work in a variety of capacities. It was when he witnessed a brutal murder that his life changed dramatically. In 1891 he entered the minor seminary in Milwaukee with the desire to become a priest. Since he continued to struggle academically, he was advised to leave and seek entrance into a religious order where he could be ordained a "simplex" priest - able to say Mass but not permitted to hear confessions or preach formally. Praying before a statue of the Blessed Mother, he heard a distinct voice telling him to go to Detroit where the Order of Capuchin Friars was established. Answering this call, he was received into the Order in 1897 and given the religious name, Solanus. His earliest assignment was in Yonkers, NY where he served as sacristan, then director of the altar servers, and then porter or "doorkeeper," answering the bell at the monastery door. Although these were considered minor jobs intended for "rookie" priests, the humble Father Solanus took great pride in them. At the monastery door he became much-loved by many who sought counseling, especially the poor. He continued this humble service in a number of friaries throughout New York and eventually returned to Detroit where remarkable cures by him were reported. As Father Solanus aged and his health declined, he recognized his own limitations and weaknesses that come with being human. Slowly he turned away from practical matters, encouraging those he met to seek union with God. This, in turn, opened himself to even greater receptivity to God. Fr. Solanus died on July 31, 1957 at the age of 86 and was declared Venerable by Pope John Paul II in 1995. Indeed his entire life was spent in total sacrifice for the glory of God, fulfilling to perfection the duties of a Christian, Religious, and Priest of God. May he one day soon join the ranks of the heavenly saints!

Through the intercession of St. John the Evangelist, may we follow the example of Blessed Solanus Casey who lived and taught how to love God and how to love the sick and the poor.

AN UPDATE ON FATHER O'SULLIVAN

As many of you are aware, immediately following our 7:00 PM evening Mass on November 1st, Father O'Sullivan was taken by ambulance to St. Mary's Medical Center. Upon arrival at the hospital, the doctors diagnosed that Father had perforated his bowel, probably a week before he arrived at the hospital on November 1st.

Father underwent surgery on the morning of Thursday, November 2nd to address his perforated bowel and to remove two infectious abscesses that had developed in his abdomen and his leg.

After his surgery on Thursday morning Father was kept in a medically-induced coma until Saturday afternoon.

After spending a week in the critical care unit at St. Mary's Medical Center, Father was transferred to a rehabilitation center where he is receiving physical therapy to restore his health.

Due to the seriousness of his surgery and condition Father O'Sullivan has been told by his doctors that he needs two to three months of complete rest before he can return to any normal Pastoral activities at the parish.

In the meantime our Parish staff and many of our parishioners are working to make sure that our Ministries and activities continue on a normal basis in our Parish.

Please continue to keep Father O'Sullivan in your prayers during his recovery, so that we can welcome him back to our parish as soon as his doctors say he is physically able to return to his ministry among us.

SAINT CATHERINE OF ALEXANDRIA



Learned in science and oratory. Converted to Christianity after receiving a vision. When she was 18 years old, during the persecution of Maximus, she offered to debate the pagan philosophers. Many were converted by her arguments, and immediately martyred. Maximus had her scourged and

imprisoned. The empress and the leader of Maximus' army were amazed by the stories, went to see Catherine in prison. They converted and were martyred. Maximus ordered her broken on the wheel, but she touched it and the wheel was destroyed. She was beheaded, and her body whisked away by angels.

Immensely popular during the Middle Ages, there were many chapels and churches devoted to her throughout western Europe, and she was reported as one of the divine advisors to Saint Joan of Arc. Her reputation for learning and wisdom led to her patronage of libraries, librarians, teachers, archivists, and anyone associated with wisdom or teaching. Her debating skill and persuasive language has led to her patronage of lawyers. And her torture on the wheel led to those who work with them asking for her intercession. One of the Fourteen Holy Helpers.

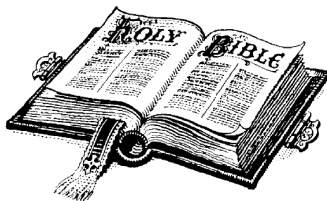

"An ApPEALing Campaign"

In his bulletin column on October 22nd, Father O'Sullivan wrote about his desire to install a carillon bell system in our Church. "In the sacrament of Penance, the Catholic faithful obtain from the mercy of God pardon for their sins. At the same time, they are reconciled with the Church, which they have wounded by their sins and which works for their conversion by charity, example and prayer. Only those who have the use of reason are capable of committing mortal sin. Nevertheless, even young children and persons with intellectual disabilities often are conscious of committing acts that are sinful to some degree and may experience a sense of guilt and sorrow. As long as the individual is capable of having a sense of contrition for having committed a sin, even if the sin cannot be described in words, the person may receive absolution. Those with profound issues may participate in penitential services. "All are welcome!"
