Why? Why? WHY? Dear friends, do you ever remember hearing that question from your children or grandchildren? And, your response: Well. . . because . . . At times you might have grown weary trying to figure out what to say and how to explain whatever the child needed to know. But, friends, we all know that it is important to know not only why – but the reason behind the why! It is easier to do something when we know the “why” behind it!

So, my challenge today on this beautiful Solemnity of Christ the King is to try to explain some of the minor adjustments you may have noticed happening during the Mass. First of all, the Mass is not changing. It never changes! However, as we continue to unpack the beautiful liturgical document, the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy (1965), we can discover that everything that happens in the liturgy – and everything we do in the liturgy – not only has meaning, a theological reason, but it also continues to draw us to God. What we do always points to God!

So, what are some of the minor adjustments being made?

- The cantor and lector now approach the ambo and leave the sanctuary via the center aisle. Only Scripture is proclaimed (or sung) at the ambo. We, by reason of our Baptism, have the privilege of proclaiming God’s very Word. That is why we come forth from the baptized and return to the body of the baptized faithful in such a visible, deliberate manner.

- The stand from which the cantor sings has been moved closer to enable us not only to see and hear him/her but to also recognize the invitation offered to us to sing. Raising our voice in song is one more significant way that we offer praise and thanksgiving to God.

- The General Instruction of the Roman Missal states that the hymn sung at Communion accompanies the entire ritual; therefore, the music begins as the priest is receiving from the chalice and continues until the last person has received. This corporate act of oneness signals to us a very important point: we are all one in Christ, our King, and he has made us one in his Kingdom, the body of Christ. Our hymn needs to speak of this oneness! Oh, and yes, time for private prayer and reflection will follow as the vessels are cleansed.

These are just a few of the ways that we can continue to deepen our understanding of why we do what we do in the Sacred Liturgy. Even if at times we are tempted to resist change or so-called adjustments (big or small) we can simply but steadily set our gaze on Christ the King who was sent to be an example for us. Let us then bow low and walk in his ways, knowing that every act of reverence, every manner by which we point to God, will fill us with the humility we need to show that we are called to serve the Ruler of our Life, Jesus Christ, our King!

Through the intercession of Saint John the Evangelist, may we be ready, open, and willing to live with these words on our lips: The kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours! Amen.

## **AN UPDATE ON FATHER O'SULLIVAN**

As many of you are aware, immediately following our 7:00 PM evening Mass on November 1st, Father O'Sullivan was taken by ambulance to St. Mary's Medical Center. Upon arrival at the hospital, the doctors diagnosed that Father had perforated his bowel, probably a week before he arrived at the hospital on November 1st.

Father underwent surgery on the morning of Thursday, November 2nd to address his perforated bowel and to remove two infectious abscesses that had developed in his abdomen and his leg.

After his surgery on Thursday morning Father was kept in a medically-induced coma until Saturday afternoon.

After spending a week in the critical care unit at St. Mary's Medical Center, Father was transferred to a rehabilitation center where he is receiving physical therapy to restore his health.

Due to the seriousness of his surgery and condition Father O'Sullivan has been told by his doctors that he needs two to three months of complete rest before he can return to any normal Pastoral activities at the parish.

In the meantime our Parish staff and many of our parishioners are working to make sure that our Ministries and activities continue on a normal basis in our Parish.

Please continue to keep Father O'Sullivan in your prayers during his recovery, so that we can welcome him back to our parish as soon as his doctors say he is physically able to return to his ministry among us.

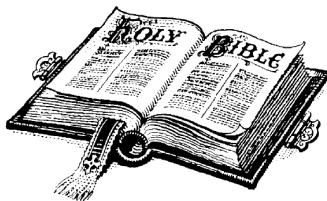

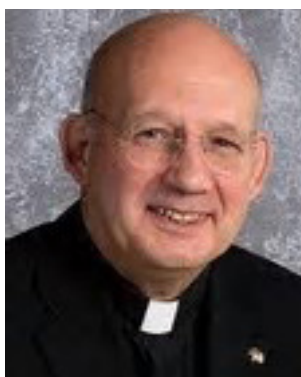

For 15 years, Mr. Joseph Fabrizio, has brought his knowledge and love of the Catholic Faith to all the fifth graders that he teaches each Monday evening in the PREP program. He is a Council Rock History teacher for 20 years and is currently in Grade 8 in Newtown Middle School. Mr. Fabrizio spends hours using technology to make the textbook material come alive for the 12 students who attend his class. He is a witness of his own faith and his active participation in the parish as an usher and his educational background as a teacher enable him to convey the many tenets of the faith to his students. One of the traditional projects takes a deeper look at the apparitions of Mary. The students put much effort into this and when completed present the finished project to their classmates. Parents and friends are invited to hear, from the student, the meaning and details of the apparitions. Using the Smartboard exclusively with numerous pictures enhances the lessons tremendously.

Mr. Fabrizio wishes to bring to each student an understanding of the sacraments and because they are taught in class he hopes that each student realizes the impact it has on their own personal faith journey. It is when the students learn about the miracles that they understand that this is proof "that our Catholic faith is real." His other goals are to help the students realize that they will be challenged in their faith beliefs and that they are to learn how to say no when this happens. "Without a doubt, God is real and He does exist and cares about all people."

Mr. Fabrizio brings to his class his expertise as a professional educator and the students realize fully that the PREP class is yet another extension of their school day. The concentration on the subject matter and the need to learn are driving forces that make his class so rewarding. His main goal is to have the students and parents understand that "Catholicism is the one true rstanding for the Catholic faith that few can surpass.

Mr. Fabrizio, at this time of Thanksgiving, brings to the forefront the true meaning of "love" and "hope." As stated above, he wants each student to "know that there is definitely a God." All learn more about why our Catholic faith should be the primary focus in our lives when speaking to him or learning from him. And for this I and all who come in to contact with Mr. Fabrizio are truly blessed!!

On December 11, 2017 at 5:15 pm, we are having our first Penance Service for all PREP students who are in Grades 3-10 and we ask that you as a family come to celebrate with us and go to Confession. Sunday PREP is invited to attend and prepare for a tremendous Advent.

"For the sacrament of Reconciliation, in the case of individuals who are nonverbal or who have minimal verbal communication ability, sorrow for sin is to be accepted even if this repentance is expressed through some gesture rather than verbally. Many Catholics experience communication difficulties related to autism spectrum disorder, traumatic brain injury, post stroke complications, and other conditions. Catholics with communication disorders, may be permitted to make their confessions using the communication system with which they are most fluent. Individuals preparing for the sacrament are to be taught to be as independent as possible." All are welcome!
