He has much healing ahead of him, but is confident of his recovery and is in good spirits. He is very grateful for your support. All that being said; he still needs to be included in our daily prayers. He will be visited daily by a visiting nurse and occupational therapist.
- Despite the day long snow fall, Saturday's [12/9/17] Christmas Bazaar was well attended and enjoyed. The foul weather did not seem to discourage anyone from participating in this great tradition. Many thanks to all of those who volunteered to make this a most enjoyable occasion, and to those who "patronized" the Bazaar. Certainly, Santa Claus got an eyeful of the wonderful people of St. John the Evangelist. I don't think SJE is going to get any coal in their stocking this year!
- Your spirit of generosity and unselfishness was on full display last Sunday as over 1,200 separately wrapped Christmas gifts were collected and prepared for delivery. These will be delivered by the Knights of Columbus to St. John's in Center City. 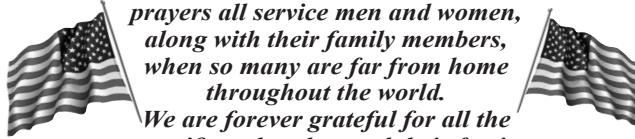

### **AN UPDATE ON FATHER O'SULLIVAN**

Dear Friends,

As many of you know, on Thursday, November 2nd, I had emergency surgery for a perforated bowel. I spent a week in Saint Mary's Medical Center; a week in Rehab; was readmitted to Saint Mary's for an abdominal infection for another week; then returned to Rehab at Saint Joseph Manor for another week of rehab. I was discharged from Saint Joseph Manor on Friday, December 8th and returned to the rectory. While I am in the rectory, my doctors have told me that the next two months should be concerned with rest and healing. So, over the next two months I will be like the Holy Spirit - I will be among you, you just won't be able to see me! My doctors anticipate that sometime in late January / early February, I will be able to return to pastoral duties on a limited basis. But for the next couple of months, I will be occupying myself with rest and continued recovery. I hope that my days in the hospital (and rehab) are behind me. I ask for your continued prayers that my recovery will be smooth and uneventful, enabling me to return to my duties as pastor!

Through the intercession of Saint John the Evangelist, may we be living examples of the gospel he has handed on to us!

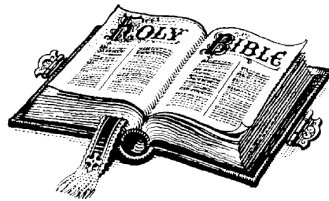

# PREP HAPPENINGS

Today, I am spotlighting a special person who embodies the message of hope and joy that this Advent Season brings to all of us as we joyfully prepare for the birth of Our Savior. She brings much to the PREP program and has done so for 8 years.

Mrs. Helen Persichilli has been married for 19 years to Mark and they have two daughters, Daniela and Christina who attend Pennsbury School District. The Fourth grade Sunday PREP students are privileged to have her as a teacher. Each student has their own template of the Ten Commandments which aids them in learning all ten of them. The children also make a "DISCIPLE PROMISE" at the beginning of the school year that they hang up in the classroom to decorate and brighten the room. They learn how to apply their faith to their everyday life. Examples are shared by the students on how this is done.

Games are played to help review the materials taught. Some of the games include Jeopardy, Hangman, and an interesting version of Tic Tac Toe. "I want PREP to be fun, not just reading and homework and testing" and this helps the students learn and reinforce the concepts needed to be mastered.

At the end of the year they meet with Ms. Ami Taddei's Fourth grade class and play a big game of PREP JEOPARDY to see what the students have learned over the course of the year. And with these two incredible teachers the outcome is always great and makes teaching a worthwhile commitment.

There are some great artists in the class and they have decorated the classroom with their drawings that include PREP topics. Bags for the P&J parish drive in November spotlighted these artistic talents. When an art project is offered, they are ready to take the challenge. The PREP lessons are "for our lives inside and outside the Church." The teacher wants to make each class relevant to the lives of the students. "I want them to see that we are not just learning abstract concepts, that everything we learn this year is an extension of what they have learned in the past and what they will build on as they move forward in their PREP careers. Mrs. Persichilli tries to show the students that the Ten Commandments are not "just rules made up for people thousands of years ago." The fourth graders realize that the lessons on the Commandments "have meaning for us today and we can follow them in our everyday lives."
